



# \*FREE TRAINING – DISABILITY WORK PROGRAM

## About the program

This course is designed to equip students with the skills to provide physical and social support to people with a disability in hostels, group homes, and community settings.

## What the program involves

With a strong practical focus, you will gain the skills required to become a disability worker. Students will learn how to communicate appropriately with clients and colleagues, how to deliver the best service to clients and how to support group activities. Undertaking this course will also support you in studying areas such as providing care and support to aged people and those in home and community care settings.

## \*Entry Requirements

- A job seeker (not currently working)
- Australian citizen or a permanent resident of Australia.
- #17 years of age or above.
- Not self-employed or a full-time student

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to work in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

# Students under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval.

## Program Outcomes

Graduates will be able to work in the aged care industry, government bodies, community organisations, disability services, Home and Community Care (HACC) services, and health agencies.

## Industry Placement

Industry Placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills and work experience.

## Recognition of Prior

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency.

An educator will advise you when completing this task. Enquire if you think you qualify.
