CHC30708 Certificate III in Children's Services

What does the course involve?

This course is recognised as the appropriate training for childcare assistants who wish to be qualified as a childcare worker. Units cover all aspects of childcare, from providing food and physical care, to responding to illnesses and accidents. You will learn how to foster and support the emotional well being of infants while overseeing their physical, social and psychological development. Undertaking this course will also ensure you can provide appropriate administration support in a child-care facility, while also providing a safe and healthy working environment.

A Vocational Placement component of 160 hours forms an essential part of the competency-based training and assessment to provide you with practical job skills and work experience.

Entry Requirements

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to work in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

Overseas students require language proficiency of IELTS level 5.5 or equivalent.

Students also have to apply for a Working with Children Suitability card.

How long does it take?

The course duration is 20 weeks, 20 hours per week. The delivery mode involves 15 weeks of class delivery (theory); students attend class three days per week. The educator works with local Childcare Centres during this time to organise 160 hours of field placement over the last 5 weeks. During the final 5 weeks, the educator then visits each individual student in the field to assess their competency.

What are my employment opportunities?

Certificate III graduates will find employment as an assistant in a child care centre or kindergarten, nanny, family day care provider, or an assistant in outside school hours care.

Support

Vocational Placement

Vocational Placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills and work experience. The educator will assist you in organising 160 hours of vocational placement.

Assessment Methods

The assessment criteria are identified in each module and assessment methods may include:

- Practical application of knowledge and skills;
- Case studies;
- Oral or written presentations;
- Short answer or oral knowledge tests;
- Project and research tasks;
- Work environment observations;
- Any other strategy that viably demonstrates attainment of learning outcomes

Delivery Methods

The training comprises of classroom delivery and various simulated and/or real practical case studies. Learning guides, videos and competency record books provide additional support to deliver the program. Lectures, tutorials, demonstrations, guided practice, group work, role plays, reflections, and vocational placement are the main teaching-learning methods used by the College. Your educator will assist you in finding a compulsory vocational placement.

Resources

All learning material is supplied and comprehensive library resources are available for students use.

Pathways

Career opportunities include child care assistant, family day care worker, or nanny within the Children's Services Industry. Students may further their studies undertaking a Diploma of Children's Services (Early childhood education and care)

Recognition of Prior Learning


Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. Enquire if you think you qualify.
