AUR50105 Diploma in Automotive Management

What does the course involve?

The Diploma of Automotive Management provides students with skills and knowledge enabling them to work in a technical or managerial capacity within the Automotive Industry. Students will develop advanced managerial, practical and technical skills. This course is for people seeking the skills and knowledge to work independently, or at a supervisory or managerial level, or to operate a business in the automotive industry.

The course is designed for front line managers, team leaders, supervisors and other people who require a solid foundation in automotive management skills. It provides managers with a range of proven skills and techniques, which will enable them to manage their business and their employees effectively. The leadership and management skills essential for this role are the main focus of the course.

To achieve a Diploma in Automotive Management students must complete a total of TWENTY-NINE (29) units of competency. This comprises of THREE (3) core unit of competency plus TWENTY-SIX (26) elective units of competency as detailed in the packaging rules and listed below:

Entry Requirements

Students must comply with one of the following:

- Students must be 18 years of age or over.
- Successful completion of AUR30405 Certificate III in Automotive Mechanical Technology
- Satisfactorily completed Year 12 or overseas equivalent
- Overseas students require language proficiency of IELTS level 5.5 or equivalent.

How long does it take?

The course duration is 45 weeks (3 Semesters over 12 months) 20 hours per week.

What are my employment opportunities?

Upon successful completion of this Diploma, employment opportunities may exist in managerial, supervisory and technical positions within the Automotive Industry.

Assessment Methods

The assessment criteria are identified in each module and assessment methods may include:

- Practical application of knowledge and skills;
- Case studies;
- Oral or written presentations;
- Short answer or oral knowledge tests;
- Project and research tasks;
- Work environment observations;
- Any other strategy that viably demonstrates attainment of learning outcomes

Delivery Methods

The training comprises of classroom delivery and various simulated and/or real practical case studies. Learning guides, videos and competency record books provide additional support to deliver the program. Lectures, tutorials, demonstrations, guided practice, group work, role plays, reflections, and vocational placement are the main teaching-learning methods used by the College.
