



CHC30402 Certificate III in Children's Services

WHAT DOES THIS COURSE INVOLVE?

This course is recognised as the appropriate training for childcare assistants who wish to be qualified as a childcare worker. Units cover all aspects of childcare, from providing food and physical care, to responding to illnesses and accidents. You will learn how to foster and support the emotional well being of infants while overseeing their physical, social and psychological development. Undertaking this course will also ensure you can provide appropriate administration support in a child-care facility, while also providing a safe and healthy working environment.

WHAT ARE MY EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES?

Certificate III graduates can find employment as a Assistant in a child care centre or kindergarten, nanny, family daycare provider, or an assistant in outside school hours care.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

The full time course duration is 20 weeks, 4 days per week plus field placement and tutorial support.

The part time course duration is 30 weeks, two nights per week.

The total weekly contact hours for international students is 23 hours including tutorial support days and field placement.

The Flexible Delivery Program is an individually tailored program in which you choose the method to study the units (i.e., classroom and/or self-paced or external). The duration of this program is up to 12 months.

Note: All duration times stated are the maximum timeframe to complete the program and published fees cover this timeframe. Students who have not completed their qualification in the stated timeframe can continue the program self-paced on a per unit basis at an additional cost.

FIELD PLACEMENT

Field Placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills and work experience. There are two placements of 120 hours that the Head of Children's Services Studies will assist you in organising.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To work in the Children's Services Industry you must be **at least seventeen years of age**. It is strongly recommended that you consider this when enrolling. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to study in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

Overseas students require language proficiency of IELTS level 5.5 or equivalent.

SUPPORT

King's undertakes a duty of care towards its student body and offers course counselling as required.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. **Enquire if you think you qualify.**
