Health and Ageing CHC40108 Certificate IV in Aged Care

Course Overview

This qualification is designed to equip students with the skills to work in Aged Care facilities, hostels, group homes and community settings. With a strong practical focus, you gain the skills required to perform personal care and activities of daily living to elderly individuals and people with a physical and/or psychological disability.

You will learn how to work with and provide services to people with complex needs, promote independence and community participation and supervise a small number of workers. Undertaking this course will provide career opportunities such as becoming a Care supervisor, Personal care worker, Accommodation support worker, or a Program support worker.
