Children's Services CHC51008 Diploma of Children's Services (Outside school hours care)

Course Overview

Do you enjoy being with children? Do you have patience, understanding, energy, adaptability and a willingness to take responsibility, this course will further develop these natural abilities.

This course covers workers who conduct vacation programs as well as before and after school activities for children of school age. As an outside school hours care worker, you are responsible for planning activities and provide care to children, facilitating their leisure and play and enabling them to achieve their development outcomes.

External 18 months

Successfully completed the CHC41208 Certificate IV in Children's Services (Outside school hours care) or CHC30708 Certificate III in Children's Services (core units) or equivalent.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

RPL allows the competencies you already possess to be recognised, regardless of how you obtained them. These might include skills you picked up on the job or from other life experiences that do not necessarily include formal training.

These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result may exempt you from studying these units. Please be aware that there are costs applied to RPL application.

Please note for RPL of this qualification, you are required to be currently employed in the outside school hours care industry.

Field Placement

Field placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical components. There are 160 hours of field placement for this Diploma, this forms part of your training. Educators for Children's Services will assist you in gaining appropriate field placement. If you are currently working in the industry you are able to undertake your field placement at your place of employment.
