CHC41602 Certificate IV in Community Services (Lifestyle & Leisure)

What does the course involve?

This course is for people who work or want to work in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres as a leisure officer, recreational activities officer, diversional therapy assistant or support worker.

You will develop the skills and knowledge to assist in the design, implementation and evaluation of health and leisure for clients. This includes knowledge of leisure and health programming, legal and ethical considerations, and workplace safety as well as specialist communication skills.

The units of competency that form the qualification are:

- CHCCS405A** Work effectively with culturally diverse clients and co-workers

- CHCRH4B** Co-ordinate, implement and monitor leisure and health programs
- CHCCS401A** Facilitate Co-operative behaviour
- CHCOHS301A** Participate in workplace safety procedures
- CHCGROUP3C** Plan & conduct group activities
- CHCNET4A** Work with other services
- CHCAC6C** Support the older person to meet their emotional and psychosocial needs
- SRCCRO009A** Conduct a recreation program for older persons
- CHCCS3C** Co-ordinate the provision of services and programs
- CHCCS402A** Respond holistically to client issues
- CHCADMIN3B** Undertake administrative work
- CHCCD12D** Apply a community development framework

How long does it take?

The course duration is 52 weeks. The delivery mode involves workplace delivery.

Note: All duration times stated are the maximum timeframe to complete the program and published fees cover this timeframe. Students who have not completed their qualification in the stated timeframe can continue the program self-paced on a per unit basis at an additional cost.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. Enquire if you think you qualify.

Entry Requirements

Entry is available to those working in Aged Care.

The course has an integrated learning focus incorporating some classroom and workplace training, including research projects.

Assessment

In general terms, assessment during training may involve direct performance evidence from:

Extracted examples within the workplace; and natural observation in the workplace; and simulations, including competency and skills tests, projects, assignments, role plays and group work in the classroom, written and practical workplace tasks

Supplementary evidence, from: Oral and written questioning; Written Journal; Personal reports and Witness testimony

Students will be given advance warning of the time and form of any assessment and will not be expected to undertake an assessment for which they have not prepared. Students will be given an opportunity for one reassessment of competencies not achieved on the first attempt.

Ongoing email and phone support is offered during the duration of the course.
