



## CHC30408 Certificate III in Disability

### What does the course involve?

This course is designed to equip students with the skills needed to work in the community and/or residential facilities under direct or regular supervision.

With a strong practical focus, you will gain the skills required to become a disability support worker, care assistant, residential care officer, in-home respite care worker, community house worker or an accommodation support worker.

You will develop skills in communication, networking, and group work and provide vital services in personal care, residential support and community integration.

Units of competency that form the qualification are:

- CHCCS411A** Work effectively in the community sector
- CHCDIS301A** Work effectively with people with a disability
- CHCDIS302A** Maintain an environment to empower people with disabilities
- CHCDIS322A** Support community participation and inclusion
- CHCDIS323A** Contribute to skill development and maintenance
- CHCICS301A** Provide support to meet personal care needs
- CHCICS302A** Participate in the implementation of individualised plans
- CHCICS303A** Support individual health and emotional wellbeing
- CHCICS305A** Provide behaviour support in the context of individualised plans
- CHCOHS312A** Follow safety procedures for direct care work

#### 4 Elective Units

- CHCCOM403A** Use targeted communication skills to build relationships
- CHCCS400A** Work within a relevant legal and ethical framework
- CHCICS401A** Facilitate support for personal care needs
- HLTHIR403B** Work effectively with culturally diverse clients and co-workers

### Entry Requirements

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to work in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

Students younger than 18 years must have parental/guardian approval.

### How long does it take?

The course duration is 16 weeks. The delivery mode involves 12 weeks of theoretical class delivery (three days per week) and 4 weeks of field placement.

### What are my employment opportunities?

Graduates will be able to work in the aged care industry, hospitals, in local government bodies, community organisations, Home and Community Care (HACC) services and health agencies.

### Support

King's undertakes a duty of care towards its student body and offers course counselling as required.

### Work experience

Work experience forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills. You will be required to complete up to 100 hours of work experience with a supervisor's report. Your educator will assist you in finding a suitable work experience location.



## Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning provides you an opportunity to have your current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires you to gather evidence confirming your competency. An educator will advise you in this task. **Enquire if you think you qualify.**
