## CHC40208 Certificate IV in Home and Community Care

### What does the course involve?

This course addresses work in client homes and community settings. It is designed to equip students with the skills to carry out activities related to maintaining an individual's well being through personal care and other activities of daily living.

You will develop the skills and knowledge to provide services to individuals with complex needs, work with groups of older people, liaise with professionals and service providers, and supervise a number of workers.

### Entry Requirements

To gain entry into this course the candidate must be recognised as competent, against compulsory units from CHC30308 Certificate III in Home and Community Care.

### Support

### How long does it take?

The course duration is 52 weeks. The delivery mode may involve workplace delivery.

### Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. **Enquire if you think you qualify.**
