CHC40608 Certificate IV in Leisure and Health

What does the course involve?

This course is for people who work or want to work in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres as an activities officer, community leisure officer, disability officer, diversional therapy assistant or recreational activities officer.

You will develop the skills and knowledge to assist in the design, implementation and evaluation of health and leisure for clients. This includes knowledge of leisure and health programming, legal and ethical considerations, and workplace safety as well as specialist communication skills.

Units of competency that form the qualification are: 13 Compulsory Units

- CHCCOM403A** Use targeted communication skills to build relationships
- CHCCS400A** Work within a relevant legal and ethical framework
- CHCCS401B** Facilitate responsible behaviour
- CHCICS405A** Facilitate groups for individual outcomes

- CHCORG405C** Maintain an effective work environment
- CHCRH401A** Work effectively in the leisure and health industry
- CHCRH402A** Undertake leisure and health programming
- CHCRH404A** Plan, implement and monitor leisure and health programs
- CHCRH405A** Plan leisure and health programs for clients with complex needs
- CHCRH406A** Apply knowledge of human behaviour in leisure activity programs
- CHCRH407A** Apply sociological concepts to leisure and health
- HLTAP401A** Confirm physical health status

3 Elective Units

- CHCGROUP403D** Plan and conduct group activities
- CHCICS302A** Participate in the implementation of individualised plans
- CHCICS404A** Plan and provide advanced behavior support

Support

Ongoing email and phone support is offered during the duration of the course.

How long does it take?

The course duration is 52 weeks. The delivery mode involves workplace delivery.

Note: All duration times stated are the maximum timeframe to complete the program and published fees cover this timeframe. Students who have not completed their qualification in the stated timeframe can continue the program self-paced on a per unit basis at an additional cost.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units. However, there is a cost related to obtaining Recognition of Prior Learning.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. Enquire if you think you qualify.

Entry Requirements

Entry is available to those working in Aged Care.

The course has an integrated learning focus incorporating some classroom and workplace training, including research projects.

Costs

The costs includes all compulsory costs to complete the qualification, this includes learning resources, assessment and academic support.
