HLT51607 Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled/Division 2 nursing)

What does the course involve?

This course will provide a successful student with the skills, knowledge and a recognised qualification to apply to the Queensland Nursing Council for recognition as an endorsed enrolled nurse or to other state registering authorities for recognition as an Enrolled Nurse (EN). The Diploma of Nursing is an ideal course for students who are either working in an aged care or health facility as an Assistant in Nursing (AIN) or thinking about starting their study to work within the industry. You will be taught the basics of legal requirements, ethical practice, medical terminology, health assessments, care plans, communication, and safe practice. You will also gain competence in the workplace while supervised by a Registered Nurse (RN). The course is made up of 26 units of competency from the following list.

What are my employment opportunities?

This course opens up a wide range of options for you. Upon successful course completion and registration as an Endorsed Enrolled Nurse with Queensland Nursing Council, you will be qualified to work within hospitals, the aged care industry, in local government bodies, community organisations, Home and Community Care (HACC) services, and health agencies.

An enrolled nurse is a person with appropriate education preparation, who is enrolled and licensed under the Nursing Act 1992, to practise nursing under the supervision of a registered nurse. The enrolled nurse is individually responsible for assigned functions and accountable to the registered nurse for delegated actions.

The responsibilities of the enrolled nurse include:

- Assisting clients with the routine activities of daily living
- Recognising the changing needs of clients
- Performing assigned and delegated functions from the nursing plan

The enrolled nurse role is complementary to that of the registered nurse. Enrolled nurses work with other health professionals under the supervision of registered nurses" (Decision Making Framework, Queensland Nursing Council, 1998:5).

How long does it take?

The course duration is 18 months. Students usually complete the units within 3 semesters.

Note: All duration times stated are the maximum timeframe to complete the course and published fees cover this timeframe. Students who have not completed their qualification in the stated timeframe can continue the course at an additional cost.

Learning Model

The course utilises **TWO** types of delivery:

- **Internal Delivery:** requires students to attend classes three days per week. These days will be identified prior to commencement of course;
- **Blended Delivery:** requires students to attend “**one week**” on campus residential sessions every term. (10 weeks) **NOTE: to be eligible for the blended delivery, students must be currently employed in the Aged/Nursing**

Clinical placement

Clinical Placement forms an essential part of the competency-based training and assessment to provide you with practical job skills and work experience. There is 400 hours of clinical placement. Placements may be in hospitals and aged care facilities. The Head of School (Health) will assist you in organising the clinical placements.

Note: Students are required to obtain a positive **Blue card** and **police check** at their own cost prior to placement. Students will be unable to attend placement without these positive notices and therefore be unable to complete placement and satisfactory complete the course.

Additional Resource requirements

Students will need to purchase writing materials, 2 ring binder folders, paper, and have access to a computer with internet access & office software to complete assignments.

Award

On successful course completion, students will be issued with a Diploma.

Entry Requirements

Students must be **at least 18 years of age** and have successfully completed Year 12 or equivalent. Mature aged students (over 21) can apply under the Alternative Entry Category. A Certificate III in Aged Care or equivalent is desirable.

Students must have sound computer skills to access interactive sessions.

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to study this course please discuss this with an educator to arrange assessment.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning/Current Competence provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units.

The RPL/RCC process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you in this task. *Enquire if you think you qualify.*

Ongoing email and phone support is offered during the duration of the course.
