



*FREE TRAINING – AGED CARE PROGRAM

About the program

This program is relevant to those with an interest in personal care support in aged care services. The training is based on the National Community Services/Aged Care competency Standards and reflects nationally endorsed industry requirements. The purpose of this training is to provide a range of accredited training units of competencies from the Certificate III in Aged Care Work qualification. The Certificate III in Aged Care Work is the industry standard for workers within the aged care sectors. These workers provide services to aged people and the ultimate goal of this relationship is a state of health, well being and independence appropriate to the aged person's needs and desires.

What the program involves

This course is designed to equip students with the skills to provide physical and social support to elderly individuals and people with a physical and/or psychological disability in Aged Care facilities, hostels, group homes and community settings. With a strong practical focus, you will gain the skills required to become an assistant in nursing. Students will learn how to communicate appropriately with clients and colleagues, how to deliver the best service to clients and how to support group activities.

Undertaking this course will also support you in studying areas such as providing care and support to aged people with disabilities.

*Entry Requirements

- A job seeker (not currently working)
- Australian citizen or a permanent resident of Australia.
- #17 years of age or above.
- Not self-employed or a full-time student

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to work in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

Students under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval.

Program Outcomes

On successful completion of this program you will receive a nationally recognised Qualification in Aged Care from the accredited Community Services Training Package. Graduates will be able to work in the aged care industry, hospitals, in local government bodies, community organisations, Home and Community Care (HACC) services and health agencies.

Field Placement

Vocational Placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills and work experience. There is one placement of 100 hours that the Head of Community Services (Health) will assist you in organising.

Recognition of Prior Learning
