



*FREE TRAINING – CHILD CARE PROGRAM

About the program

This course is recognised as the appropriate training for people who wish to be qualified as a childcare worker. Units cover all aspects of childcare, from providing food and physical care, to responding to illnesses and accidents. You will learn how to foster and support the emotional well being of infants while overseeing their physical, social and psychological development. Undertaking this course will also ensure you can provide appropriate administrative support in a child-care facility, while also providing a safe and healthy work environment.

Employment Opportunities

Certificate III graduates may find employment as an Assistant in a child care centre or kindergarten, nanny, family day care provider, or an assistant in outside school hours care.

*Entry Requirements

- A job seeker (not currently working)
- Australian citizen or a permanent resident of Australia.
- #17 years of age or above.
- Not self-employed or a full-time student

Students must be competent in Literacy in order to fulfil course requirements. If you feel you have literacy needs that may impair your ability to work in this program please discuss this with an educator and an assessment interview can be arranged.

Students also have to apply for a Working with Children Suitability card (Blue Card) and receive a positive notice to be able to complete the course

Students under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval.

How long does it take?

The full time course duration is 30 weeks, 2 days per week plus field placement.

Field Placement

Field Placement forms an essential part of your competency-based assessment and provides you with practical job skills and work experience. There are two placements of 80 hours that your educator will assist you in organising.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning provides students an opportunity to have their current skills and competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you are about to commence and as a result can exempt you from studying these units.

The process requires students to gather evidence confirming their competency. An educator will advise you when completing this task. **Enquire if you think you qualify.**
